**ORIGIN:** In the kingdom of ancient China and of spring and they use to play a role of king of bovines "*Nieou-Wang*", setting Taoism, Lao Tseu is often represented as a noble nor a warrior could not have a horse. In Chinese language the generic term "car". The specimen here belongs to the buffalo is also an astrological sign of patience.
